ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

We are committed to working with communities where we operate to maximise the benefits and minimise the impacts resulting from our activities.

The Proposed Development has:

- A 26-year life-of-mine (LOM), at a planned mining rate of 500,000 tonnes per annum.
- An estimated pre-tax cashflow of A\$1.97B, which would move through the South Australian economy over the course of the Project.
- A pre-production capital estimate of A\$13M, with a maximum cash requirement of A\$28M prior to initial revenues being received.
- Budgeted construction capital of A\$69M for Stages One and Two.

EMPLOYMENT

The Proposed Development has the potential to generate direct employment for 55 to 75 employees. It is expected that this workforce will be sourced and reside locally. These jobs include:

Stage One, capital development (construction) will include:

- road building and intersection upgrades

- construction of office, workshops, ablution block
- construction of hard stand area.

The processing facility (Stage Two) construction will require:

- fixed plant delivery/transport
- construction of tanks and bunding
- concreting
- shed building

- plumbing
- electrical reticulation
- crane hire
- mechanical installation
- general construction

OPERATIONS

During mine operations contractors will be required for:

- cleaning
- haulage
- supply of fuels and lubricants
- general consumable supplies (hardware, etc.)
- transport and delivery.

- earth moving/civil works
- uniform suppliers
- safety equipment suppliers
- hardware/auto
